Greetings in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ. I hope and pray that this brief letter finds you well and at peace through faith in Him; Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27).

Lord willing, and as planned, through this Sunday, March 29, we'll continue with our current worship schedule—the daily devotion, Sunday worship with Worship Anew (www.worshipanew.org), and individual or household appointments as you might desire.

## Also, please note:

 Because the health orders forbid, under the threat of criminal prosecution, gatherings of ten (10) or more people, we must limit the number of people at each of our services to seven (7), to allow for myself and our organist. So, as soon as possible, please call or email me to reserve your place at your preferred service;

- Our order of service will be a shortened, spoken form of our regular Divine Service with Holy Communion, lasting about thirty (30) minutes. I'll print the service in a bulletin, so that we don't need to handle our pew Bibles or hymnals;
- I'll prepare Holy Communion myself, following the public health recommendations. Also, I'll set the elements out so as to allow us to receive Holy Communion while maintaining the recommended social distance;
- I'll clean our buildings' door handles, railings, pews, and so forth, after each service;

However, if the public health orders become more restrictive, Lord willing, toward the end of next week, I'll provide an appointment schedule for individual or household worship with Holy Communion.

Finally, if you're not comfortable attending our worship services at this time, certainly, I understand. And, if you're not feeling well, I'd ask that you please follow the public health recommendations and stay home.
